Note that we report the capacity of IC church as 460. You can see from the 2009 figures that only the 4:00 and the 5:30 could conceivably be combined into one Mass. But that would be a real squeeze. (This is one of the purposes of the October count, to allow the archdiocese to plan ahead in view of the shortage of priests. In their planning, they try to avoid having a lot of Masses with the churches half full or less.)
